#### A wish tucked away

Seventy-eight year-old Grandma Tsang joined the Fulfill a Wish Programme, part of the Volunteers for Seniors Day 2014. Her wish was to sing Cantonese opera once again.

To enjoy this pastime, one needs to have the money to pay the eight musicians that accompany the singer. When Grandma Tsang was younger, she looked for every opportunity to sing, sometimes shelling out as much as HK\$10,000 to sing just one piece.

As Grandma Tsang aged and her money dwindled, she could no longer enjoy her passion. But how she wished she could!

#### "Interesting but we had not a clue'

A group of four women was assigned to help Grandma Tsang fulfill her wish. One of the women, Queenie, shared.

"When I found out Grandma Tsang's wish, I thought, 'how interesting!' But at the same time, I felt clueless. After all, Cantonese opera is an old


their non-stop hands made 250 adorable yellow

Bolivia is a country sandwiched between Peru, Chile, Argentina, Paraguay, and Brazil. It is the second poorest



#### Meet a dreamer

Fifteen year-old Jose and his five sisters live with their parents in a rural community near the city of Oruro, Bolivia, about 200 kilometers from La Paz. The family is poor. Their lives are hard. But that does not stop Jose from dreaming about becoming an agronomist (specialist in farming) when

he grows up.



### Fighting to keep the dream alive

Jose's parents took him and traveled many hours to La Paz to seek urgent care. When they arrived at Hospital Arco Iris, Jose was in critical condition. He had to have emergency surgeries to remove the tumor as well as to help him breathe.

Thanks to generous donors who support HOPE worldwide and Hospital Arco Iris, Jose's life is saved, for now. But he and his family are just starting their difficult battle to fight this rare but treatable cancer. Jose will need additional surgery and cancer treatment.
