Stretching out a helping hand

Granny Chan, an elder who is suffering from Parkinson's disease, is now living alone. She used to rely on an umbrella to walk around, and her small wish was to have a proper crutch that fitted her height so that she could walk steadily when going out.

When the volunteers visited her, they found that the ceiling of her home was severely peeling off and had not been repaired for a while. Granny's husband is living in a nursing home after a stroke, so she has to deal with all family affairs alone. All the difficult tasks such as maintenance works have been put on hold for a certain period.

This group of volunteers had no experience in home renovation work but they really wanted to help Granny Chan, so they contacted HOPE *worldwide*, and finally found a professional to teach them how to fix and paint the ceiling. In one afternoon, the ceiling and window grilles of granny's home were repainted. Granny was very grateful as she finally got help, and could enjoy the Lunar New Year in a refreshed environment.

Due to the pandemic and limited mobility, Granny Chan has not seen her husband for a few years. We hope that they will be able to reunite after the COVID restrictions are eased.









Contentment brings happiness

Uncle Chan, who is also living alone, is unable to work since he is diagnosed with lymphoma. He needs to go to the hospital every weekday for electrotherapy.

Uncle Chan used to be a blue-collar laborer. Even though he is seriously ill in recent years, he is still optimistic. When asked about his needs, he just wished everyone good health and happiness. He also encouraged this group of young people to think ahead, keep up with the development of the society, and be a future leader. The volunteers were greatly inspired by Uncle Chan.

The volunteers took Uncle out to buy a new pair of shoes and encourage him be positive for his medical treatment. Uncle enjoyed studying Chinese fortunes in his free time. He was very grateful to this group of young people for visiting and chatting with him which had not been allowed for a while.

Uncle Chan might need to switch treatment methods in the near future. We wish Uncle good health and there are suitable medicines to ease his condition.



Be attentive to the needy

Fung and his wife Wendy visited an elder with a few teenagers on the Elderly Day. During the visit, they found that this elder had no bed in his home. He was sleeping on the floor even during the cold days which was not good for his health. They started searching for a suitable bed and found a free one on the internet. They immediately contacted the owner and arranged to send it to the elder's home.

They didn't stop there. They also helped to tidy up the place to make room for the bed and arrange cleaning so that the elder could enjoy the New Year festival in a refreshed environment. The enthusiasm of Fung and Wendy greatly motivated the others in meeting the needs of the elderly.

An elder in the 'Fulfill a Wish' Program simply requested to dine with the volunteers. However, a kind volunteer noticed that the elder's toenails were too long and had gray nails during his first visit, so he contacted a nail barber to visit this elder for manicure service.

A blind elder, Uncle Ma, participated in the 'Fulfill a Wish' Program this year. He wished to dine with a group of friends.



Over the years, HOPE worldwide organized various volunteering activities and made an impact by gathering resources and manpower to serve the needy, meeting their needs and building a harmonious society.


'C' stands for Christ, Compassion and Care, and can also be interpreted as "giving" in Chinese. HOPE worldwide

Brenda and Jackson met Granny Chan when they served as volunteers in the 'Fulfill a Wish' Program certain years ago. Granny was living on a wheelchair, she needed some help for visiting her father who was living in a nursing home at that time.

That visit was very meaningful because Granny Chan's father passed away not long after. Brenda and Jackson become friends of her since then. They would regularly phone her to show their care or send supplies to Granny if she lacks anything.



Granny Chan's wheelchair broke down recently. Jackson immediately ordered some parts and brought the tools to Granny's home. While her husband was busy at repairing, Brenda picked up the hair cutting tools to help Granny's haircut and chatted with her. Granny Chan seldom went out and contacted the outside world, so she was very excited and talkative when the guests visited her. Annie, Brenda and Jackson just make one further step, extending the hand of friendship and becoming friends with the beneficiaries. Healthy Ageing: Revitalizing the aged group



'Santa Claus Orientation' was one of the activities under the 'JC InnoPower@ Healthy Ageing in Park' program. Most of the elder anticipate to live in the same community when they are ageing but able to walk is a crucial factor. HOPE worldwide cooperated with the Sham Shui Po District Health Center to conduct a sarcopenia assessment for the elderly, and invited them to participate in a 10-week fitness class to strengthen their body muscles.





'Santa Claus Orientation' was held at the end of last year, inviting this group of elders to prove the effectiveness of their training by treasure-hunting in the Sham Shui Po area. While happily chatting and walking with friends, most of them could complete the walk within 1.5 hours. With strengthened muscles, they are able to go anywhere now in the community without any difficulties.
